The proposed plan is to construct a single story 9,900 square foot machine and fabricating facility with associated parking, drainage, and utility infrastructure within buffer zone. (Continued from 7/25/2022).

Michael Dryden explains that revisions have already been made to the original application. Michael presents the original plans to the commission to give them a sense of the revisions that have been made to the plans. Michael does mention the building program has not been changed at all based on the original plans. Michael explains that the building is planned to be constructed in two phases firstly, 7400 sq ft and the secondly at 2500 sq ft. On site there will be 13 Parking spaces, 11 in the front and 2 in the back. Michael mentions that water and power service is readily available but there is no sewer access to this site. Michael mentions that some of the original plans showed basins within 100ft of a vernal pool, which has been revised. Michael brings up the revised plans and mentions the size of the building and the building program has not



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changed on the revised plans. Michael mentions that he got rid of the open basin, removed the subsurface basin, put it under the parking lot and added a second infiltration system. The new plans show there are no longer any stormwater BMPS located within 100ft of the vernal pool. Michael explains that the stormwater management system is designed in accordance with the local conservation regulations. Michael also mentions that the drainage system will be fully peer reviewed. It is also pointed out that they comply with the 25ft no disturbance zone and the closest the work gets to the BVW is 58ft. It is also mentioned that DEP has not supplied any comments about this project at this time. John Thomas comments that John Chessia will be peer reviewing this project for stormwater, with the hope to have comments available in time for the next meeting. Lisa Carrozza comments that the GC BVW series at the top of the plans seems to be cut off and that in any potential order of conditions it should be noted that the 100 series in the corner has not been confirmed. John Thomas mentions that Michael can take that off the plan for the next rendition and write language in a potential order consistent with the flags shown on the plan. Lisa asks if the vernal pools should be labeled with their individual certified vernal pool number. John mentions that if they have numbers, they should be labeled but that Natural Heritage is a bit backed up at this time and these vernal pools may not have received their numbers yet. Lisa asks that the consultant put the numbers on the plan once they are available. Lisa also asks if they will have to do any additional test pits due to the changes made to the plans. Michael confirms that Lisa is correct and that new test pits will be required. Michael asks that if the commission is amendable that it be conditioned that they can do the testing during the time of construction. It is also mentioned that system one in the front is almost 4ft above ground water, and system two in the back is 3ft above ground water. Lisa brings up that this project will be constructed in two phases, and asks how phase two will be left after phase one is complete. Michael mentions that they will probably install a temporary bituminous curb and then it will be left as grass. Lisa comments that it should be put on the plan so that the contractor knows how to leave the site. John asks if the commission would like to request contracting plans. Lisa comments that it isn't needed as long as it is mentioned on the plan set. Lisa also asked if there will be any outdoor storage or any activities taking place outside. Michael mentions that it is his understanding that everything will be taking place inside the building and that there will be no outside storage. The applicant Joseph Kessler confirms that there will be no



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outside storage. Lisa comments that the Natural Heritage mapping is dated as July 7<sup>th</sup>, 2022 and instead it should have been dated as the day of the published data which was August 2021. Michael explains that some of the information that is presented in the plans such as the vernal pools is not reflected on that Natural Heritage map, which is why he dated it to coincide with the plans. Tamah Vest asks why the building cannot tie into the municipal system. Michael explains that it's not really a viable option as it would need over 600ft of sewer construction. Julian mentions that there are not many areas in town that have access to sewer. James Carter, whose wife is the trustee of the hill street trust, which manages the property directly across from the proposed project, mentions that at this time he would like to reserve his right to pass judgment at a later date. Julian clarifies that conservation only has jurisdiction over work being done in the buffer zone. Julian mentions that there will be a peer review of this project done by John Chessia.

Julian Kadish asks John Thomas why the applicant filed a Request for Determination instead of an Abbreviated Notice of Resource Area Delineation. John mentions that the applicant is just trying to confirm the status of the stream which they are allowed to do through an RDA. John mentions that it is presumed that the applicant will next come in with a Notice of Intent and at that point will confirm resource areas. John Thomas comments that based on the last meeting the commission along with his observations agree that the stream does not have associated mean annual high water and therefore does not have perennial status, and therefore does not have an associated riverfront area. John mentions that the applicant has revised the plan based on all the previous comments, and that the information is sufficient for the commission to issue a determination. Lisa Carrozza comments that the BVW is not being confirmed with the determination and that the determination will only confirm whether the stream is intermittent or perennial. Gregory Driscoll shows the revised plans showing that the BVW is no longer on the plans as well as notes explaining that the plan does not depict all the wetland resource areas on the property and within jurisdictional distance to the subject property. Lisa comments that she just wants the wording of the determination to be clear. John Thomas confirms that based on the plans provided that he is comfortable with the commission voting on them.
