## IV. SIGN AND ISSUE ORDER OF CONDITIONS/ORDER OF RESOURCE AREA DELINEATION

A. DEP# 250-1127 (Map 28, Parcel 29)

On site Thomas encountered a good deal of rubber, metal, and other human-made debris in the BZ between WF 36–72, as well as a large, perhaps 18-wheeler, trailer. He recommended that OOC condition #13 require that the aforementioned waste be removed. Carrozza asked that condition #13 require the applicant to notify the Conservation Director "within 48 hours of debris removal." (Change made.) Thomas asked that the applicant provide the Commission with a SWPPP along with a revised construction plan giving their thoughts on the visual barrier, which Thomas wanted at least 100' from the vernal pool. He wished it to be made clear to local residents that there was a vernal pool there and that they should not engage in activities inappropriate beyond that point. Kadish noted that most the conditions are "boilerplate" and Thomas concurred: He had been making needed changes to a standard template generally agreed on by the Commission.

Carrozza questioned condition #21: How would "proof" of debris removal be authenticated? Photographs? Condition #21 should be altered to clarify what form the confirmation should take. Thomas: It could be a statement from me indicating that I was confident that the work was done. Kadish, Carrozza, and Fernandes reworked the language of #21d to read "Written confirmation from the Agent that pre-existing man-made materials within 100 feet of BVW were removed."

Thomas added an NDZ clause to condition #46 and asked the Commission whether they thought posts would be sufficient or whether they should condition an entire split rail fence. Kadish pointed out that there was only one residence near the site and, because the site is not near housing—the safety of children would be a concern—a split-rail fence along the entire length of the site might not be necessary.



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Thomas: The vernal pool is downgradient of two residences, but it's more a matter of the project's stormwater components being closer to the vernal pool. I think posts are sufficient but leave it up to the Commission. Kadish said that if Thomas, who had seen the site in detail, thought that posts were sufficient, he would be comfortable with that. Thomas: Yes. Fernandes: Did they mark it on their maps? Thomas: They did not and thus I added a condition that the applicant indicate a visual barrier on the map with the idea that they would work out the exact details with the Commission at a later date. Fernandes: In fairness, much of the work appears to be beyond 50' and it's not clear how much of the work even touches the 25' NDZ. Thomas: My thought was that the posts would serve as an anticipatory "preventative measure." Carrozza, concurring, warned against an incoming landowner exceeding even those set bounds.
