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I. NEW PUBLIC HEARINGS

A. DEP#250- 1133-ANRAD- 55 Newland Street (Map 2/5, Parcels 1/6,9 & 96)

The applicant requests verification of on-site resource areas.

Andrew Gorman of Beals & Thomas addressed the Commission on behalf of the Daggett-Crandall-Newcomb Home. Ken Christafoli, on behalf of the applicant, and Dan Gagne of Beals & Thomas were also on the call. Turning to Mass Mapper, Gorman showed the meeting the four separate parcels—some forested, some with open fields—on which potential work would sit. They lie not far south and west of the Canoe River and include part of DCN Home and the Red Mill Trail. The site also contains not less than 47 "depressions": a number of BVWs, some directly abutting the Canoe River, and a number of ILSF sites not subject to the WPA, and IVW sites. Gorman moved on to BLSF sites. The site's "G-series" area is subject to the WPA.

Kadish: Questions? Thomas had "no issues" with the resource area delineation, flags were well-placed, and the site visit went well. The site does have standing water and PVPs. The applicant presented information regarding ILSFs to the [Conservation Director]. Carrozza: The FEMA map [depicts the site as] an A zone [in which no elevation is determined], not an AE. You [the applicant] must show how the elevation has been established, possibly by HEC-RAS simulation to show how flooding is associated with the river. The elevation hasn't been established. Gorman (answering): We're concerned with determining whether the BLSF would exceed the wetland boundary or 100' buffer zone and continue into the "non-jurisdictional upland." We digitized the FEMA Zone A line. Carrozza (recapitulating): "There's no way we can align whether it goes into an upland area because you haven't assigned an elevation to it: Correct?" Gorman: Yeah.... We wouldn't be able to seek a definitive flood evaluation from the Commission. Carrozza: "We can't issue an ANRAD because [this plan] does not disclose all the resource areas on site. We're not just going to leave off a flood zone.... We can't issue [an ANRAD] unless we know definitively where the flood zone is." Gorman: We've had other interactions where we've taken the BLSF out of the application and would be willing to do that now. Carrozza: John Thomas, we're going to have to talk about this from a "regulatory perspective" because I don't think [the Commission] "has ever issued an ORAD for BVW, ILSF, riverfront, but not flood zone." Thomas: "If the applicant is asking not for confirmation of the resource area itself, we would obviously condition that this resource area has not been confirmed in an ANRAD. If the application were to enter a "next phase," delineation of the flood zone would have to be revisited, "fleshed out." Carrozza: In that case, I would ask you to remove from the application any reference to the 100-year flood zone and BLSF so that when we do the ORAD it will just include the set and not BLSF. Kadish: I would second that and question whether that purple line was established by a much courser technology [than is now available]. Carrozza: But what it means is that FEMA hasn't established an elevation of the flood zone, an A Zone, which is just a 100-year flood line. When there's only an A Zone, the applicant is obliged to report that measurement. Kadish agreed 100%. The application offers conflicting information, and it must be noted that it does not establish land subject to flooding. Thomas: The applicants also wish to define both ILSF and BLSF. Gorman: Correct. The place in question is the "G-series." Kadish: So what you're saying is that that [the G-series] doesn't have a hydrological connection but it is subject to flooding and nonjurisdictional with regard to the buffer? Gorman: Correct. Kadish: But establishing the floodplain is a



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different process. Gorman (agreeing) pointed out that one of the areas of concern was an ILSF and other ones BLSFs. Carrozza: Do we want an application returned to us, John Thomas with all the references to BLSF deleted? Thomas: They could label zone A as "approximate" but specify in the application that the BLSF would be defined prior to any NOIs or other applications. Prior to issuing, the application will also contain which areas contain PVP habitats as well. Gorman asked whether the application could include information from a springtime evaluation. Thomas: Correct. Kadish: John [Thomas], do you have adequate information to approve the application minus the flood zone? Thomas: I have looked at the flags [which are good], PVP areas, ILSF calculations. Area IBWG looked as if it is ILSF. There were areas that didn't seem to match the groundwater modeling. But other than that, I think I could get information ready for the next meeting. Carrozza: Yes, it's just that we wouldn't issue the ORAD until a note about the LSF were appended to it. Is that OK, Andrew [Gorman]? Gorman: Yes.

B. DEP#250-TBD-NOI-S. Worcester & E. Hodges Street

The applicant proposes to replace 4,500 linear feet of cast iron water mains on S. Worcester and 2,130 linear feet of cement water main on E. Hodges.

Devin Herrick, Tara McManus, and Jordan [?] of Weston & Sampson represented the Town of Norton before the Commission. The Town" proposes "to replace the existing 6-inch through 10-inch unlined cast iron water mains along South Worcester Street and the 8-inch asbestos cement water mains along East Hodges Street." Herrick showed slides indicating wetlands and waterbodies close to both streets. Perennial stream crossing would not be impacted by the proposed construction. The main on S Worcester would be replaced with a 12-inch ductile iron water main with an additional 400' of structural liner; the 2,130' on E Hodges would be replaced by an 8-inch ductile water main. Water services would be replaced from the new main to the existing curb stop. (For details about excavation, backfill, repaving, sediment control, etc., see Weston & Sampson's Powerpoint presentation.) No NHESP regulation is expected as the work is to be confined to roadway, but the DEP considers the area within the local ACEC.

Kadish: You didn't mention any difficulties with the stream crossings: Any comments? McManus: There are no expected issues with the stream. Test pits have been bored, but the applicant proposes simply to reuse the piping already in the ground. Thomas asked for the impact to be shown on the screen because he said that there would be less of an impact than the apparently excessive calculations would suggest. McManus emphasized that there would be little impact to the riverfront.

Kadish: I assume the material you excavate will go directly into trucks and not be stockpiled on the road? McManus: While we plan to stockpile on the road during the working day, we plan to clean it up so that none of the excavated material will remain at the end of the day. The work would be similar to

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other roadwork done in Norton and we would be using silt socks and don't anticipate any "issues" with runoff.

Carrozza: Flood zones? Herrick pointed them out. Carrozza: Thomas, please add a condition forbidding stockpiling in the flood zone. There doesn't seem to be any room for dewatering: Where would you do that? The Commission could condition that in an OOC. McManus: We've had, as you know, significant rainfall recently...if you'd like to put the onus on the contractor, we agree. Carrozza: Are there any viable locations that the Town might use in the vicinity for stockpiling. You could reflect the information in the spec[ifications]. McManus: Stockpiling will only happen for 20–30 minutes. Carrozza: I'm concerned about a flash flood that could occur over the weekend. McManus: There won't be stockpiling on this site and a lay-down yard will be located elsewhere. Carrozza: Thomas, would you condition a lay-down sight? Thomas: Yes.

Herrick moved on to a presentation of E. Hodges. Carrozza (Regarding E. Hodges]), we don't like to see strawbales because they degrade when they are saturated with water, which is especially troublesome when they are picked up. Would you substitute compost filters for the proposed haybales? McManus: Yes. Carrozza: Is there curbing along either street? McManus: No, for the most part it's country drainage, I believe. Carrozza: All the more reason.... So if you could just replace that with a compost filter tube or equivalent. McManus: Okay. When will the work start? Herrick: Not until we get permits...hopefully this fall and probably completed in a six-month period of time. Kadish to Thomas: Enough information to close? Thomas: We need a DEP number. Carrozza: We cannot close without it. Thomas: In the interim I could start drafting an OOC. Kadish: It won't delay things if we're continuing to the next meeting anyway.

B. DEP# 250-1128 - 36 Dean Street- Goosebrook Garage Recycle, LLC. (Map 3, Lot 31-01)

Applicant proposes to replace a failed sewage disposal system and install a concrete pad with underground waste oil tank compliant with MassDEP Regulations, 310 CMR 80.4 – 80.22 within buffer zone to BVW and Riverfront area.

Kenneth Paul Gilchrist and Daniel Orwig of Orwig Associates represented themselves before the Commission. Carrozza expressed an interest in seeing stabilization plans included: We need the plan to show what ground cover will be like when the work is completed—that there will be significant recovery. That was missing from the plan. Orwig: We can include that information in the plan. Except for the trees being removed from the location where we will place the concrete pad on which we would work, the area is devoid of vegetation. We would seed the area after the construction. Thomas: I would add the following condition to the OOC: "Prior to the issuance of any order [the applicant] would send over the revised plan and I would put that as the final date pending the okay from the Commission for that just so that everybody's aware." Carrozza agreed.
