# FINANCE COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES February 17, 1988

The meeting was called to order at approximately 7:30 pm

Present: R. Anderson, M. Brown, J. Desrochers, J. Doherty, P. Helmreich, B. Kimball, A. Smith, D. Ward

STM petitioned article presentation
The Big E Association notes the desire of Tennants to buy
the Park and needs to have situation taken care of in order
to be able to receive a mortgage.
Request \$100,000 - 120,000 for funds till 6-89.
P. Helmreich notes that the STM can only fund till 6-88.
They will need additional article on Annual Town meeting for
funding F89.
P. Helmreich notes they can attach to an article already on
TM warrant

Big E association questions if Town has to pay to dump in Mansfield facility.

D. Ward notes the Town of Norton owns part of the Mansfield plant for critical needs and only has to pay trucking costs.

A. Smith states this area needs to be investigated more

thoroughly with the appropriate Boards.

P. Helmreich notes the responsibity of petitioners to get full information and figures. They can get assistance from Town Officials-Executive secretary, Water and Sewer Department, Board of Health.

The Big E Association notes that they have an attorney reasearching the legality of the article. The Selectmen have an opinion which notes that this is not a legal article.

P. Helmreich notes that after Town meeting approval, the article

will then be approved by the Attorney General.

The Association questions if the STM passes their article will the Finance Committee recommend an article for the ATM. The Committee cannot commit themselves at this time due to a lack of information.

P. Helmreich notes that the Town's people cannot be held to approve at the ATM.

P. Helmreich questions if this will be an annual fundings because there are no sewerage lines.

M. Brooks notes that the Town has applied for funds for Mansfield Avenue sewerage and Mr. Kraskas has agreed to pay part of project. P. Helmreich notes that the Town cannot be held to annual funding. The Big E Association feels that if the Town does not do the sewerage that Mr. Kraskas will fund the whole project. They also feel that if the Town does get grant approval, any funds

will not be needed from the Town.

P. Helmreich notes Mr. Kraskas did not make a written committment of funds for this project. This may be under negotiations but no agreement has been made.

Mr. Kraskas' funds may be pending re-zoning of the land for another project on Mansfield Avenue.

The Park owner has signed a discontinuance of the Park, therefore, the tenants have to purchase park and have already signed a purchase and sale agreement.

The Association was questioned on how they will be allowed a mortgage with just a short term resolution. P. Helmreich notes problems that may arise. The Big E Association notes that Mr. Kraskas has paid for the main engineering on North Mansfield Avenue. He has indicated he will pay if the right conditions exist. The Big E members will handle their own engineering laterals. They note the article requesting \$220,000 for engineering, consulting and design, ?? 50% of grant from DEQE for laterals. D. Ward notes Mr. Kraskas engineering is not done. M. Brooks notes grants filed on 11-30-87 to DEQE for 70% grant. B. Kimball notes Norton is the 80th on list and only 24 grants are to be approved. A. Smith requests Big E to return with further information and breakdowns. B. Kimball questions alternative solutions. The Association has looked into running lines themselves, and are currently lobbying with State officials. Mortgage costs included financing of costs. B. Kimball notes costs of plowing, maintenance of roads etc. The Park members do perform all these and plan to in the future. Discussion of trailers on another owner's property. The Association notes that their attorney is looking into this situation which includes 10 trailers and 50 feet of land The Park itself is 17 years old with 13 acres in Norton and 5 acres in Mansfield. 125 mobile Homes. Polulation of 266 as of 1-1-87.The Mobile owners had no idea of problems that could arise and stated that they would not have purchased if they were brought to his attention. P. Helmreich notes that the Park Owner can at any time, with proper notification, close the park. 12 Mobile Homes are not in Association. B. Kimball notes the taxes are currently: \$14,660 for land; \$18,000 for trailers (\$144 per traier) total of \$32,660 per year. B. Kimball notes that Mr. Enos has separated his portion of the Park from the Main portion (3.5 acres) There are currently approx 10 school age children. The Association notes the elderly home owners and the problems they will have. D. Ward notes that if grant does not go through, that Mr. Kraskas is researching his own self-contained sewerage plant. Selectmen noted that Mr. Kraskas agreed to relocate all trailers. M. Brooks notes that the Association was happy to meet with Mr. Kraskas with the Attorney but Mr. Kraskas refused meeting. The Big E Association has monthly meetings and all members who do not attend can contact Chairwormen on the action taken. P. Helmreich notes the need for cooperation of each member of Association. M. Brooks noted that the Association has received funds for the down payment but does not have any written agreements with members. P. Helmreich notes the Finance Committee needs figures for STM for this fiscal year and the Association can attach a figure for the ATM onto an expense budget, Board of Health. M. Brown notes that for the elderly in the Park should apply for Housing for Elderly if the funds are turned down.
