### **MINUTES**

### I. 7:00 P.M. Call to Order

The October 3, 2018 meeting of the Finance Committee was held in the Norton Town Hall Media Conference Room and was called to order at 7:00 P.M., by Mr. William Rotondi, Chairman.

### A. Review of Fall Town Meeting Warrant Articles

Mr. Yunits reviewed all Articles tonight. He stated that the money for these articles is coming from the following areas: \$75,000 returned from Bristol Agricultural School for fees not used, \$1, 918,144 from Free Cash, and \$84,000 from Ambulance Reserve.

Mr. Yunits also stated that there is currently \$3,340,583.00 in Free Cash and the balance will drop to \$572,791 after the conclusion of these articles.

#### Article 1 - Unpaid Bills

Mr. Yunits stated \$352.32 is needed for Planning Board expenses in the prior fiscal year.

Mr. Evans motioned to approve the transfer of \$352.32 from Free Cash. Mr. Fiore seconded. Unanimous – MOTION CARRIES

### Article 2 - Separation Expenses

Mr. Yunits stated that there are no Separation Expenses at this time.

Mr. Evans motioned for No Action on this article. Mr. Fiore seconded. Unanimous - MOTION CARRIES

### Article 6 - Capital Improvements (Funding)

Mr. Yunits recommended the transfer of \$900,000 from Free Cash to bring the total of this account to \$1,170,390.00 of which \$479,850.00 will be used to fund Article 7 if approved, leaving a balance of \$690,540.00. Mr. Evans made a motion to move \$900,000.00 from Free Cash to Capital Improvement Fund. Mr. Dorney Seconded. 9-Yes 1-Opposed. MOTION CARRIES

#### Article 7 - FY19 Capital Plan Amendment

Mr. Yunits recommended transferring \$479,850.00 from the Capital Improvements Account and \$84,000.00 from the Ambulance Reserve Fund to purchase or lease the following items:

Mr. Evans motioned to move Article 7 as written by funding with \$479,850.00 from the Capital Improvements Account and the amount of \$84,000.00 from the Ambulance Reserve for a total of \$563,850.00. Mr. Dorney Seconded. Unanimous vote. MOTION CARRIES

### Article 8 - Street Light Conversion Project

Mr. Yunits stated this is to approve a consultant which will be used for the engineering, design, and procurement services phase of the conversion of the town street lights to LED.

Mr. Evans motioned to approve the transfer of \$42,284.00 from Free Cash. Mr. Dorney seconded. Unanimous – MOTION CARRIES

### <u>Article 9 - Planning, Design, and Construction of Water Main and Appurtenance in Holmes Street and East Main Street and Associated Expenses</u>

Mr. Evans motioned to approve the \$520,000.00 from Water Retained Earnings. Mr. Dorney seconded. Unanimous – MOTION CARRIES

### <u>Article 10 - Planning, Design, and Construction of Water Main and Appurtenance in Pine Street from Well No. 1 to Plain Street and Associated Expenses</u>

Mr. Yunits stated that this article is to borrow \$2,700,000.00 for 6,100 feet of water main, appurtenances, and trench pavement extending from Well No. 1 to Plain Street.

Mr. Evans motioned to approve borrowing the amount of \$2,700,000.00 which will be paid from the Water Retained Earnings. Mr. Dorney Seconded. Unanimous – MOTION CARRIES

### Article 11 - Permanent and Temporary Easements on Land at Woodland Meadows on Southerly Side of West Main Street for Sewer Pump Station, Sewer Line, Utilities, and Access

Mr. Evans motioned to approve Article 11 as written. Mr.Dorney Seconded. Unanimous - MOTION CARRIES

## Article 12 - Permanent and Temporary Easements for Recreational Trail, Construction, Drainage, Utility, Access and/or Related Purposes in, on and under Parcels of Land Abutting and/or Near North Washington Street, Cobb Street, Arrowhead Drive, Johnson Drive, Briggs Street, and Crane Street

Mr. Yunits recommended no action needed on this Article.

Mr. Evans made a motion of no action on article 12. Mr. Dorney Seconded. Unanimous. MOTION CARRIES

### Article 13 - Route 123/East Main Street Corridor Improvement Project

Mr. Yunits recommended no action needed on this Article.

Mr. Evans made a motion of no action on Article 13. Mr. Dorney Seconded. Unanimous. MOTION CARRIES

### <u>Article 14 - Consultant for Solar Electric Procurement Support Services in Development of Solar Strategies</u>

Mr. Yunits recommended the transfer of \$15,000.00 from Free Cash for a consultant regarding possible Solar Panels on the property behind Water & Sewer Department.

Mr. Evans motioned to approve \$15,000 from Free Cash to retain a consultant for Solar Panels. Mr. Dorney Seconded. Unanimous. MOTION CARRIES

### Article 15 - Accept MGL Chapter 148, Section 56 (Parking)

Mr. Yunits stated that public parking is becoming a bigger problem in town. This would put in regulations for Open Air Parking and allow the police to have some enforcement power. There would need to be a plan showing how many cars will be parked on a particular lot, safe access in and out of the lots, no drinking on those lots. There would probably be an annual fee.

Mr. Helmreich motioned to approve Article 15. Mr. Dorney Seconded Vote 9-Yes 1-No. MOTION CARRIES

### Article 16 - Personnel Bylaw Amendment

Mr. Yunits stated that this Article will amend the Town's Personnel Bylaws to add a new position of "Payroll and Benefits Administrator" under 'Job Classification" and is also adjusting the Salary Plan as follows:

This article is to make each and every procurement contract with a value of \$5,000 or greater for all departments which has been signed and is in force accessible electronically through a link on the Norton Town Website.

Mr. Yunits recommended no action needed on this Article.

Mr. Smith made a motion to move Article 18, Mr. Fiore Seconded, 0-Yes 10-No Article not moved

### Article19 – Other Post Employment Benefits (OPEB)

Mr. Yunits requested a transfer of \$90,000.00 from Free Cash to the OPEB trust fund.

Mr. Evans motioned to transfer of \$90,000.00 from Free Cash to the OPEB trust fund. Mr. Dorney Seconded.

### Article 20 - Stabilization Fund

Mr. Yunits requested a transfer of \$300,000.00 from Free Cash. This will bring us to\$ 2.45 million and will then be at the required amount of 5% of the town budget and will not have to put any more in Stabilization for some

Mr. Evans recommended moving \$300,000.00 from Free Cash to the Stabilization Fund. Mr. Dorney Seconded. Unanimous. MOTION CARRIES
