Meeting Motions / Actions and Summary of Discussions:

Discussion

Council on Aging Study Update

J. Bargmann from Bargmann Hendrie + Archetype, Inc. reviewed 1) the survey results; 2) program and COA needs; and 3) parcel building test fits.

Survey Results

J. Bargmann provided a summary of the survey responses, prepared by Ballard King & Associates, LTD (attached), and discussed some of the responses. Respondents noted the lack of parking and small size of the existing COA facility as factors limiting attendance / use of the facility; respondents noted their current use of the COA for health & wellness programs and social activities; respondents noted a desire for a larger kitchen, exercise room, areas dedicated to seniors; respondents noted a willingness to drive up to 15 minutes to use the COA facility; respondents noted a willingness to volunteer for special events and assisting the food pantry.

Programming

J. Bargmann provided a matrix of various building sizes along with the existing the COA facility showing the various uses / functions of the facility and their respective footprints (attached). Building sizes range from 10,000 sf to 15,000 sf offering varying sized areas for lobby/ reception; administrative; program space; food service; restrooms; support services; and supportive care. It was noted that the matrix does not as of yet included space for the food pantry.

Parcel Building Test Fits

J. Bargmann provided conceptual layouts for various parcel test fits assuming a 15,000 sf COA building and 20,000 sf Town Hall on each of the parcels identified by the Town (attached).

Site 1 (0 Rear East Main Street, east of Route 495) - This parcel can accommodate both the COA and Town Hall, however the site is currently land-locked, requires a lot of site preparation, and as less than ideal. This location was deemed not feasible by the Committee.

Site 2 (47 Elm Street, Reed & Barton) – This parcel can accommodate both the COA and Town Hall.

Site 3 (22 Summer Street, Wheaton College Site) - This parcel can accommodate both the COA and Town Hall however the Committee questioned if wetlands are present and how much of the parcel is actually buildable.

Site 4 (140 West Main Street) - This parcel can only accommodate the COA facility.






Question #2 – How important is it to you to remain living in Norton?


Question #4 - Which of the following best describes your current place of residence?


Question #5 – Do you rent or own your current place of residence?






Question #9 – How often do you talk on the phone, send e-mail, use social media, or get together to visit with family, friends, relatives, or neighbors?


Question #13 – How do you meet your transportation needs? (check all that apply)


Question #14 - How satisfied are you with the transportation options available to you in Norton?


Question #15 – Do you currently use programs or services offered by the Council on Aging/Norton Senior Center?






Question #17 – The following items refer to programs and services that are currently offered through the Council on Aging/Norton Senior Center. Please rate how important each program/service is to you and/or your family?






Question #18 – How satisfied are you with the programs and services offered through the Council on Aging/Norton Senior Center?


Question #20 – In the future, how likely are you to participate in programs and services offered by the Council on Aging/Norton Senior Center?




Question #22 – Have you ever traveled to other Senior Centers or Community Centers to participate in programs or utilize the facilities those centers offered?





NORTON SENIOR CENTER 0 Rear East Main Street – East of 495











