Announcement of Class of 2017 Adams Scholarship Recipients – Dr. Baeta:

The John and Abigail Adams Scholarships provide a tuition waiver for up to eight semesters of undergraduate study at a Massachusetts state college or university. In order to be eligible students must:

- score at the *Advanced* performance level on one of the three high school state assessment tests in ELA, Mathematics, or STE (Biology, Chemistry, Introductory Physics, or Technology/Engineering) and
- score at the *Proficient* level or higher on the remaining two high school state assessment tests, and
- have combined scores from the three tests that place them in the top 25 percent of students in the graduating class in their district.

Fifty-five students qualified for the scholarship.

Discussion and Vote on Allocation of 2016-2017 School Choice Funds – Dr. Baeta:

The School Committee is required to vote on the use of School Choice funds. Dr. Baeta and Mrs. Winsper reviewed the list of technology materials, upgrades, and professional development for a grand total of \$156,485. This is the third time the Committee has voted on School Choice funds for one-time expenditures. Dr. Baeta said bringing in 50 students impacts 1,000 students. After a brief discussion, the Committee voted.

Discussion and Vote on Capital Improvement Article for Spring Town Meeting – Dr. Baeta and Mr. Wade Lizotte:

The Committee reviewed the 5-Year Capital Improvement Plan for 2018-2022. Priorities are based on recent physical plant issues. Requests include bringing the NMS Wastewater Plant back into compliance, a new fire panel at NMS, technology infrastructure district-wide, security cameras district-wide, among other necessary upgrades and safety improvements.

MASC Policy Manual Service - Dr. Baeta:

Dr. Baeta recommends that the district utilize the MASC Policy Service in order to update the 2000-2010 policy manual at a cost of approximately \$3,500/year for three years. He suggested the update process should consist of a sub-committee of two members. After a brief discussion the agenda item was tabled until the January meeting.

Information on Bid for On-Call Labor – Mr. Lincoln Lynch:

An "Invitation for Bid" (IFB) advertisement was posted in the Sun Chronicle on December 4th requesting sealed bids for on-call labor rates in the following areas: Heating System/Boiler Repair, Plumbing Repair, Roofing/Building Envelope Repair, Fire Alarm System Monitoring, Inspection and Repair, Refrigeration/HVAC Repair, and Electrical Repairs. The IFB is for an initial 6-month contract starting January 1, 2017 and ending June 30, 2017. The district then has the option of extending the contract for the following two fiscal years. Once bids are received, references will be checked, rates will be analyzed and an award of each contract will be made. Per Massachusetts General Law, Chapter 149, the final decision is based on the lowest, responsible and responsive bidder. Results will be provided to the Committee at the first meeting in January.

Voluntary Lead and Copper Testing and Plan of Action – Dr. Baeta and Mr. Wade Lizotte:

Dr. Baeta discussed correspondence sent to staff and families regarding the recent water testing. This was a voluntary program and the state advised on how it should be done. In Norton, every fixture in all five schools received two tests. The problem occurs because many of the fixtures are not being used for long periods of time, which means the water is not flowing. All faucets have been shut off temporarily, and bottled water is made available to everyone in the buildings. A flushing program was been implemented. Dr. Baeta feels the district has taken the proper steps in this matter and will keep everyone informed.

Department of Elementary and Secondary Education 2015-2016 School and District Discipline Data – Dr. Baeta:

For informational purposes, Dr. Baeta shared recently released 2015-2016 School and District Discipline Data report. Included in the report were statistics for Norton, Foxborough Charter School, and Southeastern Regional. He stated he was proud of Norton's report compared to other districts.

Other:

- The Committee discussed the budget process and tentative dates for meetings. The public hearing will be February 6th.
- Mr. Lynch and Mrs. Petrelli are working on a parent/student survey of food services.
- NMS will participate in a health survey.
- Dr. Baeta requested that the Committee authorize him to grant permission for students to remain in school here under School Choice when parents need to move for a variety of reasons. Due to the time between meetings, a decision must be made sooner. It is in the

best interest of the student to be able to continue here. Dr. Baeta will inform the Committee of any grants.

MOTION: by Mrs. Stern to authorize the Superintendent to grant permission for students to

remain in the district under School Choice.

Mrs. Cohen stated that the Ad-Hoc Committee will meet on January 12 at 6 PM to plan for future town needs.

Mrs. O'Neill discussed the \$2,000 Ocean Spray Grant.
