WETLAND HEARINGS AND POSSIBLE COMMISSION DELIBERATIONS

Wetland hearings will be taken in order.

Chairperson to read about Public Hearings:

Pursuant to Governor Baker's March 12, 2020 Order Suspending Certain Provisions of the Open Meeting Law, G.L. c. 30A, §20, and the Governor's March 15, 2020 Order imposing strict limitations on the number of people that may gather in one place, this public hearing of the Norton Conservation Commission is being conducted via remote participation. No in-person attendance of members of the public will be permitted, but the public can listen to/view this public hearing/meeting while in progress by <u>logging into the Zoom conference meeting listed at the END of this agenda</u>. Members of the public attending this public

hearing/meeting virtually will be allowed to make comments if they wish to do so, during the portion of the hearing designated for public comment, by raising their hand virtually or pressing *9 if participating by phone.

A. Notice of Intent (#250-1055). Wheaton College, 42 Howard Street. (Map 17, Parcel 14). The proposed project involves the construction of two ADA accessible parking spaces, an accessible walk along the front of an existing building, landscaping, lighting, and a proposed stormwater management system within 100 feet of bordering vegetated wetland. Mark Wixted, Zach Richards, John Sullivan and Will Granbury of Wheaton College attended the hearing in addition to John Chessia, Consultant for the ConCom.

Wixted explained this is the Old Science Building. The goal of the project is to provide entrance accessibility for those with disabilities. He reviewed the existing plan and buffers. All of the proposed work is behind the existing curb line. There is no disturbance in the 25 foot zone. He showed photos of the current conditions and plans of the proposed work. He discussed Stormwater Management. He explained the increase in impervious area for this project is very small. It is mainly for the additional parking that is required. There are infiltration trenches along the path. There is a new catch basin for the new parking area which will also collect for the existing paved area. Below the parking area, there is a perforated pipe infiltration system.

Chessia stated this project has 275 sf of new impervious area compared to what is there today. His only issue is there is a lot of fill around the building. They are proposing the infiltration in an area that is filled land. Technically, you should dig down to the native sand. However, it is a very small project.

Wixted responded that was the only comment they received from Chessia that they thought would be hard to meet. Since it is such a small project, removing all of the existing fill would be a much larger project than the project itself. Also, they are making some other improvements, and it is a redevelopment. They are asking if that one recommendation could be waved for this project. They will respond in writing to the rest of Chessia's comments.

Carlino stated the applicant had received a letter from her and responded to her comments. Her only issue was wetland being altered on the opposite side of the street. Wheaton requested to look at that separately, and not as part of this project. Carlino stated that could be appropriate. Wheaton has always worked with the ConCom on any violations or Stormwater issues. She is confident they would follow through.

Kadish asked what would be the benefit of trying to remove the fill. From what Chessia stated with the small size of the project, it would not be justifiable.

The applicant requested a continuance to 4/27/2020. Motion was made to continue the public hearing for DEP#250-1055 to April 27, 2020 by Kadish, seconded by Pearson. Motion passes.

B. Notice of Intent (#250-1054) New England Power Company, 315 & 327 Transmission Line ROW. (continued from 3/9/2020) The proposed work includes general utility maintenance activities and improvements including structure replacements, access road upgrades and work pad construction at existing structures within Bordering Vegetated Wetland, 200 feet of Riverfront Area and Bordering Land Subject to Flooding. Carlino noted the applicant is working to make sure they have the correct abutters notified while the Assessor's Office is working remotely. BSG Group has suggested they identify abutters within 1,000 square feet as required by the regulations. They will have a land surveyor verify the information on Mass GIS is correct. Carlino is asking the Assessor's Office if the Mass GIS is updated as frequently as the Assessor if there is a sale. She is waiting for a response. The applicant asked Carlino if this would be acceptable. The ConCom agreed this would be acceptable once Carlino received a response from the assessor.

The applicant requested a continuance to 4/27/2020. Motion was made to continue the public hearing for DEP#250-1054 to April 27, 2020 by Pearson, seconded by Kadish. Motion passes.

C. Notice of Intent (#250-1052) Scot & Joan Stormo, South Worcester Street (Map 26, Parcel 103 & 103-1) (continued from 12/2/19, 12/16/19, 1/13/2020, 1/27/2020, 2/24/2020, 3/9/2020). For a proposed project to construct 2 Triplex units and 5 Six-Family units with an associated roadway and 2 infiltration basins within 100 feet of bordering vegetated wetland. The applicant requested a continuance to 4/27/2020. Motion was made to continue the public hearing for DEP#250-1052 to April 27, 2020 by Kadish, seconded by O'Reilly. Motion passes.

D. Notice of Intent (#250-1040). Michael Trowbridge of Hutchins-Trowbridge Assoc. 306-308 East Main Street. (Map 5, parcel 38 and 252). (continued from 4/29/19, 6/10/19, 7/8/19, 7/22/19, 8/12/19, 10/7/19, 11/18/19, 12/2/19, 12/16/19, 1/27/20, 2/24/20) The proposed project is to construct an addition to warehouse, detention basin and grading within 100 feet of BVW.

Carlino noted the applicant has requested a continuance. However, the ConCom has not received any revised plans or documentation in over a year.

Motion was made to continue the public hearing for DEP#250-1040 to a hearing within 45 days after the current state of emergency is over by Pearson, seconded by Kadish. Motion passes.

Discussion: Authorization for electronic signatures

Carlino stated that in order to do electronic signatures, there must be a vote from the ConCom. This will authorize Carlino to record each member's intended electronic signature for each particular vote on a particular date.

Motion was made to authorize Conservation Director, Jennifer Carlino, to physically sign Norton ConCom documents on behalf of individual Norton ConCom members by Kadish, seconded by Pearson. Motion passes. A roll call was taken.

Scott Goddard of Goddard Consulting attended the hearing. He explained the owner is in the process of marketing the property for sale. There is a challenge for people accessing the property by foot due to the wetland. He is requesting to build a temporary wooden elevated platform for pedestrian access.

Carlino stated the OOC are very specific about not doing any work within the vernal pool and it is also vernal pool season. Goddard feels his request is better than walking through the vernal pool. Carlino stated the ConCom must decide a few things. Is it necessary? Does it require a change to the OOC to allow? Then it would be an amended OOC, not a minor modification.

After discussion amongst the ConCom members about their concerns, the applicant withdrew his request.
