I. NEW PUBLIC HEARINGS

Gregory Driscoll speaks to the project that is proposed on 0 West Main Street. Gregory states that this request for the determination of applicability is to confirm whether the drainage ditch on the westward side of the property is a drainage ditch or an intermittent stream. The application does not propose any work as part of the request. Gregory notes that a stream is classified as intermittent unless the stream has a



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watershed size of at least half a square mile, with a flow rate greater than or equal to .01 cubic feet per second at the 99% flow duration using USGS stream stat method. The stream stat report included the ultimate discharge point which is the Wading River, which is located past the limit of the subject property. According to the report the watershed area for the drainage basin is 0.18 square miles less than half of the half square mile required. The flow duration statistics flow report identifies that the 99% duration flow for the stream is .00331 so that's well below the .01 cubic feet per second. Gregory states that the stream should be classified as intermittent and not be subject to the river areas under that Wetland Protection Act. The resource areas that were flagged on the property were the BVW associated with the stream, as well as the 25ft no disturb, a 50ft wetlands buffer and a 100ft wetlands buffer. Gregory also points out that there is another BVW off the site which was also flagged. John Thomas comments that the applicant hired Brad Holmes and he performed 4 contiguous site visits and took photographs. Gregory comments that Brad did the flagging. John comments that he has done several site visits to check on the stream, and he confirms that the stream did stop flowing prior to the drought that started in May. John does comment that he was hoping to have the confirmation as well from the site evaluators. The pictures presented to the commission showing lack of flow for the stream were taken in June during a drought. Gregory mentions they had been unaware at the time that the drought status had been updated. Gregory mentions they have an affidavit from a previous property owner in regard to the ditch in question. In the affidavit it is mentioned that it takes drainage from catch basins from the street at the north portion of the site. John mentions that this area had seen a lot of improvements in the 90's and at the time he does not believe that area had been identified as riverfront. John does comment that the Rivers Protection Act did not come into effect until 1996. There is also the mention that the drainage ditch could have been used as a form of mosquito control. It is also mentioned that in the affidavit from Henry Sousa mosquito control is also mentioned. Lisa Carrozza asks that the applicant properly call out what the application is asking for, which is if the stream is perennial or intermittent. Lisa asks if this stream is providing a hydrological connection. John comments that based on historic aerials it seems that hydrology has changed. Lisa asks if the USGS shows the stream as perennial. John confirms that it is shown as perennial but that the onus is on the applicant to provide data to verify the state of the stream. Lisa brings up the fact that there was a drought in



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June, which is when the pictures of the site in question were taken. John mentions that at the time the photos were taken it was within a significant drought. Lisa asks what DEP's guidance would be in regards to verifying stream status in a drought. It is specifically asked if the level of drought status comes into effect. John explains that for DEP they mention extended drought status under advisory or under a severe drought, which does not seem to provide clarification. Lisa asks if DEP has any guidelines on looking back and determining at what point the commission should be focusing on reviewing the stream status. Whether it needs to be prior to the drought advisory or if a determination can be made during certain levels of drought advisories. Lisa comments that if the applicant had gone out and taken pictures prior to the drought there would be less ambiguity. Lisa makes the statement that this is a question for DEP. Gregory comments that the stream stats calculations show that they are well below the calculations. Julian comments that he believes that they are looking at an intermittent stream, and that he is unsure how the state would weigh in on this determination. Lisa comments that the state should be able to weigh in on how far back the commission goes for the definition of drought, whether they should accept any information from the advisory period or does it start with the severe drought. Lisa believes that the information will help the commission make an informed decision. Gregory comments that Henry Sousa's affidavit goes into the history of the ditch. Lisa asks if based on historic aerials was the ditch man-made. John mentions that most of the areas in that location have been subjected to farming, and a lot of the streams and bypasses are manmade. John mentions that he was out on site in February, March, April and May and it did not appear to be a perennial stream. Julian asks if based on the topography could a perennial stream even be supported. Lisa comments that it's important to know what is feeding the stream. If it is wetland fed it theoretically could be a perennial stream. Lisa does mention that the fact that John Thomas was out pre-drought is helpful information, even though the applicant does not have evidence pre-drought. John does mention in this case that because data is lacking, he is willing to support his opinion to provide the commission all the necessary information to make a decision. Lisa asks the applicant to remove the word ditch from the plans and replace it with intermittent stream. It is also asked that all the buffer zones and extra information from the plans, that does not involve the intermittent stream be removed. This application would just be approving the



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intermittent stream and no other resource on site. A continuance is recommended in order for the commission to receive the revised plans.
