#### **NEW BUSINESS**

### **A.** (DEP#250-261) 376 Old Colony Road; Response to Enforcement Order - Wetland Restoration and Mitigation Plan

Ken Thomson explains how the applicant plans to address the long-standing enforcement order. Thomson: There were two major areas of impact, one just behind the buildings and the other further back on the property. They have done some soil augers and test pits as part of the road construction. In the middle of the project Thomson has found 3ft of muck with 18–24 inches of fill on top. Thomson recommends going onto the site through the back, and if they need to build a road on top of what is already there to support equipment brought on site, they will. Thomson proposes to remove all the fill material and truck it off site, then restore the area by exposing the muck existing on site, and finally re-grading it and replanting. Thomson shows the Commission the proposed planting plan for the restoration. In the rear of the property there is a hard case road that he plans to backfill with a compost loam mixture to prevent it from draining into an excavated hole on site that has become a wetland. Thomson explains there will be 2200 LF of silt fence to protect the road. A culvert behind the buildings will provide access to the rear of the property and metal plates and timber mats will be put down to get the dump truck over it. Kadish asks if this plan addresses the lingering enforcement order. Thomas believes this enforcement order has been on the site since the late 80s or early 90s and looking at the site one can tell that the gravel road consists of decades-old fill. Thomas: Thomson's proposal addresses the major areas of the enforcement order. Thomson: To address the enforcement order he plans to later file an NOI to better utilize the entire site and address any smaller areas of concern. Carrozza: Has the applicant submitted a plan stamped by an engineer? Thomson agrees to submit one to the Commission. Carrozza: Will a wetland scientist in the field observe the proposed pit and mound? Thomson explains that he will be in the field observing. Carrozza asks that as part of the sequencing for the plan that it be made clear that Thomson needs to be contacted to oversee the work. Carrozza asks if there will be any tree clearing required. Thomson: There will not be. Carrozza asks when the work will begin. Thomson says he would like to remove everything immediately, cover any exposed area with straw, and then replant the site in the spring. Carrozza asks that that detail be added to the plans. Pearson: Will the site's multiflora rose, which is an aggressive invasive species, be removed? Thomson: It will. As the Commission is awaiting updated plans from Thomson, it continues the discussion to the 3/13/2023 meeting.

## B. (DEP#250-1122) NOI – 0 West Main (Map 21, Parcel 206)

The applicant proposes to construct a 4,000 sq ft mixed use building with associated grading, drainage, septic system, and utilities within the buffer zone. (Continued from 1/09/2023 for 3 meetings)

Driscoll believes he has addressed all the peer reviewer's comments. Driscoll explains that John Thomas and Brad Holmes identified a potential vernal pool between wetland flags A18 and A20.



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Due to this finding, Driscoll added the potential pool itself and a buffer 100ft from it to the plans. Driscoll: The stormwater basin was adjusted and the grading pulled back because of the vernal pool. The basin still holds all the volume for runoff. Driscoll: Neither basin has an outlet control structure. If needed, they do have an emergency spillway and a pipe to draw down the basin for maintenance. Driscoll: Both the sediment control plan and the landscape plan have been revised. Driscoll addresses some of Horsley Witten's comments: Regarding the rip rap setting calculation in the drainage report, it has been addressed on the detail sheet. Regarding phosphorus removal, all parties are now in agreement. Horsley Witten also asked Driscoll to add quarterly inspections of the catch basins to the O&M plans, which he has done. Horsley Witten also had some recommendations for any OOC the Commission would potentially approve. Thomas recommends that the Commission add the HW conditions in any such order. Thomas: Save for potential minor revisions that might be set in place with the OOC, this project meets all the stormwater standards. Carrozza: Why is the small infiltration basin to be located where it is? Driscoll: It needs to be a certain distance from the septic system.
