SNAP: Online shopping at Amazon and Walmart!


It's official! Massachusetts residents who receive SNAP benefits can use their EBT card to buy food online from Amazon and Walmart.



Healthy Incentives Program (HIP)

If you are a SNAP recipient, you are automatically enrolled in HIP. You can use your SNAP benefits to buy fruits & vegetables from a HIP authorized farm or vendor. Look for the HIP logo or ask the vendor if they participate in the


program before you pay for your purchase. You will receive \$1 for each dollar you spend on eligible fruits and vegetables, up to a monthly limit.



COVID-19 Economic Impact Payment Info



Millions of people will get their Economic Impact Payment by prepaid debit card

irs.gov COVID Tax Tip 2020-61 May 26, 2020

Nearly four million people are being sent their Economic Impact Payment by prepaid debit card, instead of paper check. The determination of which taxpayers receive a debit card was made by the Bureau of the Fiscal Service, another part of the Treasury Department that works with the IRS to handle distribution of the payments. These Economic Impact Payment Cards arrive in a plain envelope from Money Network Cardholder Services. The Visa name will appear on the front of the card; the back of the card has the name of the issuing bank, MetaBank®, N.A. Information included with the card will explain that the card is an Economic Impact Payment Card. Those who receive Economic Impact Payment by prepaid debit card can do the following without any fees.

- ◆ Make purchases online and at any retail location where Visa is accepted
- ◆Get cash from in-network ATMs
- ◆Transfer funds to their personal bank account
- ◆Check their card balance online, by mobile app, or by phone

This free, prepaid card also provides consumer protections available to traditional bank account owners, including protection against fraud, loss, and other errors. The card will come with instructions on how to activate and use it. Learn more at www.eipcard.com



A New Way to Sign Up for Medicare Part B

- SOCIAL SECURITY OFFICES ARE STILL CLOSED -

If you are retiring or are turning 65 and not working, and want to sign up for Medicare, you need to sign up for Medicare Part A and B before we can help you enroll in supplemental plans, part D, or Medicare Advantage.

Please read the info below on how to do this given that SSA offices are closed

As of March 17, 2020 all local Social Security offices are closed to the public for in-person service due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Social Security understands that due to current circumstances, beneficiaries may have difficulties submitting their Medicare enrollment forms by mail. To assist

those who have stopped working and are seeking immediate enrollment into Medicare Part B, Social Security has developed a method for beneficiaries to fax their enrollment forms. Please visit ssa.gov or call for information.

Medicare beneficiaries can fax Medicare Part B Enrollment Form (CMS-40B) and Request for Employment Information Form (CMS-L-564), along with proof of employment, Group Health Plan (GHP), or Large Group Health Plan (LGHP) to 1-833-914-2016, or mail to your local Social Security office. For Norton, MA residents, the Social Security office is located at 106 Pleasant Street, Attleboro, MA 02703 Contact SHINE at 508-222-1399 if you have questions. Please leave a voice mail and someone will call you back.

ONLINE PART B ENROLLMENT UNDER THE SPECIAL ENROLLMENT PERIOD PROVISIONS—Effective Tuesday May 26, 2020

SSA has a <u>new online service option</u> that beneficiaries can utilize to complete the forms CMS-40B, Application for Enrollment in Medicare - Part B (Medical Insurance) and CMS-L564, Request for Employment Information applications for enrollment in Medicare Part B. The online process will expedite the handling of those beneficiaries requesting enrollment in Medicare Part B under the Special Enrollment Period (SEP) provisions.

The online Medicare Part B SEP enrollment link www.ssa.gov/Medicare-PartB-SEP will be available on both SSA and CMS websites effective Tuesday, May 26, 2020. Once the beneficiary completes the online enrollment forms, the forms will automatically transmitted to the SSA Field Office of jurisdiction.







If you do not receive a re-certification application, or if you could benefit from Fuel Assistance, please call the Senior Center in MOVEMBER to apply.




8 Tips to Protect Yourself from Scams

- 1. Be aware that you are at risk from strangers and from those closest to you.
- 2. Don't isolate yourself stay involved!
- 3. Always tell solicitors: "I never buy from (or give to) anyone who calls or visits me unannounced. Send me something in writing."
- 4. Shred all receipts with your credit card number.
- 5. Sign up for the "Do Not Call" list and take yourself off multiple mailing lists.
- 6. Use direct deposit for benefit checks to prevent checks from being stolen from your mailbox.
- 7. Never give your credit card, bank account, Social Security, Medicare, or other personal information over the phone unless you initiated the call.
- 8. Be skeptical of all unsolicited offers and thoroughly do your research.
