Student Representatives Update:

Malia Savas and Zoe Duran updated the Committee on happenings in the schools:

LGN: Scholastic book fair; Holiday Spirit Days activities; Trait of the month is Integrity

JCS: Spirit week activities; PK – 1 Polar Express events; Grant received from the MA Cultural Council along with NEED and SPO to design and paint an ocean-themed 100 ft. long mural across the cafeteria.

HAY: Spirit week activities with a different theme each day.

NHS: Band and Chorus Winter Concerts on December 16th; winter sports underway; the Student Council Santa Fund drive raised almost \$700 for the Attleboro Council for Children's Christmas for Kids Charity; toy drive sponsored by Math Honor Society in conjunction with NPD and the C2 foundation; National Art Society sold over 200 snowman ornaments as a fundraiser; National Business Honor Society sold raffle tickets for holiday gift baskets.

Dr. Baeta and the Committee thanked the NEED organization for their work and dedication.

Presentation and Vote on NHS Cheer Trip to Nationals:

NHS teachers and cheer coaches, Kimberly Birkett and Baileigh Morse shared a slide presentation with the Committee, recapping the successful season. Permission was sought for the team to attend the AmeriCheer InterNational Championship being held in Orlando, Florida from March 18 – 21, 2022. Fundraising would take place to offset the approximate \$750 per person cost. Chaperones would consist of Ms. Birkett, Ms. Morse, and Ms. Jacklyn Dembishack. Approximately 11 to 14 athletes, including alternates, would travel to the competition.

Dr. Baeta and the Committee noted how proud they were of the squad. Dr. Baeta recognized the commitment by the coaches and team members. The season is long with competitions on weekends in addition to the support at football games.

Dr. Baeta suggested that the costs involved for the chaperones be paid for by NPS being that they are employees and, for liability reasons, are acting on behalf of the district.

Dr. Baeta also added that we are starting to see private schools give scholarship money for Adams Scholarship recipients.

Review and Vote on New NHS Courses for 2022-2023:

Principal Dolleman presented new courses for consideration for the 2022-2023 school year which were created with input from the Academic Coordinators and NHS Site Council.

Courses proposed include:

- Exploring Computer Science
- Introduction to Piano
- Recording Arts 2
- Intro to Public Speaking
- Advanced Yoga & Mindfulness (Yoga 2)

Dr. Baeta noted that some of these courses are the continuation of current courses. The Piano course would require the purchase of keyboards which is not a deal breaker. He stated that he supports these proposed courses.

Trane Update:

Mr. Wells presented a Trane update including a one page reconciliation sheet. Also included was a timeline which listed projects by school. He noted that the solar projects take more time. He is hoping to have conversations regarding the \$9,800 interconnectivity charge at JCS as this cost shouldn't be passed along to NPS.

Solar ports will be going in at NMS, NHS, JCS and HAY. These should produce enough solar energy to offset costs in the long run, and down the road for the athletic complex.

So far the projects are on budget.

Other:

- A virtual meeting for parents and students regarding the Early College Program is scheduled for January 6th at 6:30 p.m. via Zoom. The presentation is for current 10th, 11th, and 12th grade students. The program is through UMASS Dartmouth and other UMASS system schools as well as Boston Architectural College. A cohort of students from Norton and other area schools would attend classes together and would earn college credits at locations to be determined. This is not dual enrollment. Courses would consist of live instruction for 60-90 minutes 2 to 3 times a week. Regarding fees, there should be some type of fee as a "buy-in". Currently there is no list of prerequisites. Credits would be transferable in the state college system.
- Dr. Baeta congratulated Karen Winsper, Director of Instructional Technology, for being the recipient of a \$2,500 donation to a nonprofit or educational agency from Future of Privacy Forum.
