NORTON SCHOOL COMMITTEE MINUTES OF MEETING

Date of Meeting: Thursday, November 10, 2022

Call to Order: Chairperson Sheedy called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

Student Representatives Update:

Antonio Romano updated the Committee on school happenings, as follows:

NMS – Annual Turkey Carnival fundraiser taking place to support Norton Cupboard of Kindness; visit by local motivational speaker, The Machine Jesse Green; 6th grade students to participate in Zoom webinar with experts from NOAA regarding shipwrecks and ocean cartography; 7th graders participated in a day long, unit wide, thematic unit based on the novel, Peak by Roland Smith; 8th grade students and the foreign language department held various activities centered around the Mexican holiday known as Día De Los Muertos.

JCS – Annual Veteran's Day assembly held outside at the flagpole with 15 veterans in attendance; students have been collecting turkey feathers all week as they demonstrate the school's expectations ahead of Thanksgiving.

HAY – Students working to earn 50 #PBIS hashtags which earns them a book from the HAY PTO vending machine; Good-News-Calls-Of-The-Day can be earned from any staff member at any time for being Respectful, Responsible, or Safe or for having a great week or day, or for helping a friend in need.

NHS – Spirit week next week; in-school performance of Almost, Maine; hallway decorating the Tuesday before Thanksgiving; Pep Rally and Powder Puff Football game the Wednesday before Thanksgiving; Semi-Formal on December 2nd.

Opening of School Remarks:

Principal Hayward reported that NMS had a good opening, welcoming back 567 students and 66 teachers and staff, including eight new staff members. Four athletic teams competed in the Massasoit League in cross country and soccer. Eight student athletes and eight partner students participated in unified bocce. Seventeen students competed on NHS teams in football and boys and girls soccer. Clubs and activities are underway as well as band and chorus. The Halloween dance had 300 students in attendance. NMS has been implementing E-Hall Pass, PBIS, and IMTSS initiative. The 30-minute after school extra help time began in October and many students have been taking advantage of the opportunity.

Principal Dolleman recommended these students to Dr. Baeta for receipt of the awards. Dr. Baeta read bios on the students as provided from the NHS guidance department. The students, along with their families, were present at the meeting. School Committee members offered congratulations to the students and certificates were distributed.

Review and Vote on Superintendent's Goals:

Dr. Baeta presented the Superintendent's Goals: 2022-2024 to the Committee as follows:

Student Learning Goal #1: Implement Vision 2026 priorities for the current school year. Actions to include March and June updates to Vision 2026.

Professional Practice Goal #2: Complete by June 30, 2024 Learning Walks by building. Actions to include providing data from Learning Walks twice during the year and data provided to School Committee in the spring.

District Improvement Goal #3: Implement the Integrated Multi-Tiered System of Support (IMTSS) district wide. Actions to include creation of IMTSS teams to create opportunities for student learning with attention to reading, writing, and arithmetic student supports; and creation of student support programs to accelerate learning loss.

Dr. Baeta explained that during Learning Walks the Principals go to other schools, and along with other district administrators work in teams and visit 5 to 6 classrooms for ten minutes. Following the classroom visits there is a debriefing period in the conference room. Then data is shared with teachers.
