MINUTES OF MEETING

Date of School Committee Meeting: Thursday, March 9, 2023

Location: Norton Middle School Auditorium

Present: Committee Members: Chairperson Mr. Dan Sheedy, Vice Chairperson Mrs. Sheri Cohen, Mr. Deniz Savas, Mrs. Carolyn Gallagher, Mr. Nick Schleicher. Also present: Superintendent of Schools Joseph F. Baeta, Assistant Superintendent for Teaching and Leaning Jennifer O'Neill, School Business Administrator Kristine Hadfield, and Student Representatives Malia Savas and Antonio Romano.

Call to Order: Chairperson Sheedy called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

Pledge of Allegiance

Chairperson Sheedy announced that the meeting was being recorded by Norton Cable and asked if anyone was recording to let the Committee know.

Recognition of North Youth Football and Cheer:

Dr. Baeta recognized Norton 12U Cheer Squad for their second consecutive National Championship and the 14U Cheer Squad for their 3rd place finish at the AYC National Championship. The 14U Cheer Squad became the first cheer squad in the entire country to reach three straight National Championships. The 5th Grade Junior Lancers were recognized as the 2022 EMASS Super Bowl Champions. The youth groups were present and presented with certificates from Dr. Baeta.

Dr. Baeta and the Committee congratulated Victor Rodriguez for his 15 years of service and dedication to the NYFC program.

NMS Project 351 Ambassador:

Mr. Ronnie Goldstein reported to the Committee that Project 351's mission for this year is Embrace... Hope, Unity, and Love. He acknowledged this year's NMS Ambassador, Vanessa Lee. She presented to the Committee her experience on Launch Day. For the Annual Spring Service, they will host a fundraiser and collect clothes from each school to be donated to "Cradles for Crayons." The fundraiser will kick off the weeks of March 20th and 27th. Dr. Baeta and the Committee congratulated Vanessa and presented her with a certificate.

Therapy Canines Civics Project Presentation:

NHS 10th Grade student, Maya O'Connell, provided the Committee with information about her civics project for approval to bring in therapy dogs. She has been collaborating with Adrianne Musto, a certified member of the BONES therapy dog of Massachusetts team. Also present was therapy dog Molson. Together, their goal is to provide social and emotional support needs to

students. Dr. Baeta and the Committee presented her with a certificate. The first reading of a Therapy Dog policy will be on the agenda for the March 23rd School Committee meeting.

STEAM Showcase and Prospective Advanced Manufacturing Pathways at NHS:

Ms. Kerri Murphy, NHS Teacher, addressed the Committee about the upcoming STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, the Arts, and Mathematics) Showcase. The Norton STEAM Showcase is a community STEAM event showcasing student work and Norton businesses and connecting NPS students with organizations in STEAM. The event is to be held March 21, 2023 at NHS.

Ms. Murphy also discussed a new program being implemented at NHS, Advanced Manufacturing Innovation Pathways, with the goal of meeting labor demands of Bristol County and preparing students for careers in manufacturing, from machines to design engineers. She explained all can participate and why this program is being added at NHS.

Dr. Baeta presented a slide presentation with the recommended FY'24 school budget. He reviewed topics such as school enrollments, staffing, NESDEC Reports, grants, effects of the State Budget, and net school spending formula. Dr. Baeta recommended a 9.10% increase, for a total budget of \$36,364,830. This information is provided on the Norton School Website.

LGN/JCS: Will be hosting a visit from author/illustrator Peter H. Reynolds on Tuesday, March 14th. He will be sharing a book he illustrated for Marc Colagiovanni. Staff, students and faculty are excited to see and talk with one of their favorite authors.

HAY: The first annual HAY PTO Trivia Night will be on Friday, March 9th. They had author visits over the past two weeks. They continue to get closer for the new playground to be installed in the Spring.

NHS: 32 Students left today for Boston to attend the State DECA competition. Several members of the Best Buddies participated in the Polar Plunge to raise money for the Special Olympics. Chairperson Dan Sheedy clarified the IMB documentation was provided for informational purposes only, was not an agenda item, and no discussion on this policy would be heard.

For the record, Dr. Baeta read allowed the state regulation included in the proposed Secondary Students Freedom of Expression Policy. Dr. Baeta also provided the Committee with recommendations to be added to the state policy regarding issues of communication. The Committee discussed and included additional recommendations regarding the policy.
