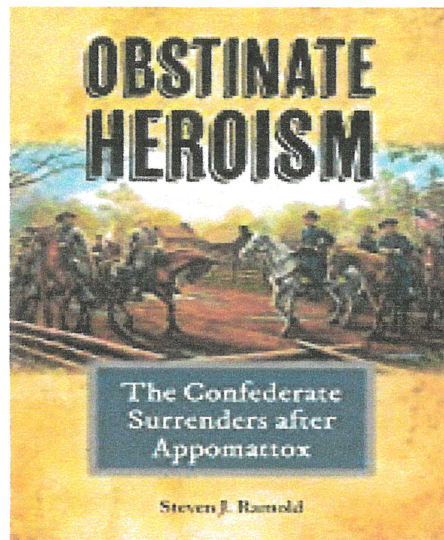


Olde Colony Civil War Round Table



Most Civil War history books leave off with Lee's surrender at Appomattox. But the Confederacy had thousands of soldiers under arms, in three major Confederate Armies and numerous smaller units still fighting the War. All the armies could continue the War if they chose to do so. But they did not, even when their political leaders ordered them to continue the fight. Convinced that most civilians no longer wanted to continue the war, the senior Confederate military leadership, over the course of several weeks, surrendered their armies under different circumstances. The end of the Confederacy was a messy and complicated affair, a far cry from the tidy closure associated with the events at Appomattox.
